Presumably the Inspector's decision and report will make reference to the Statements of Common Ground, and, should the proposals be approved, the measures set out in these statements will presumably form part of any Conditions or Planning Agreement.

In the case of the SoCGs agreed by Kent Wildlife Trust, I would therefore like the Inspector to understand the background to these documents and the reasoning behind the measures set out in them.

I would therefore propose only to withdraw those parts of our proof where we make the case that there will or may be an impact on biodiversity, and that the proposed mitigation will be ineffective; that is, sections 11.1.1, 12, 13.2.3 - 13.2.4, 14.7 and 14.9 - 14.15. The rest of the document and appendices provide the evidence to demonstrate the need for the implementation of the measures set out in the SoCGs. I am concerned that, should I withdraw all the Trust's evidence, the Inspector will have insufficient understanding of the context of the proposals and the SoCGs.

Can you let me know if you feel that this would not be an appropriate way to proceed?
